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Caregiver Resources and Needs for Early Childhood Report

























This report reviews areas of need for caregivers and highlights areas where caregivers can be a resource for the child. This report is specific to each of the caregiver's children. The Child and Family Team works together to support the caregiver in addressing needs and making progress towards goals. Areas rated '2' are actionable and may be a focus of care. Areas rated '3' are a priority and require immediate or intensive action. Areas rated as a '1' are potential needs and areas with no need are rated a '0'. Some areas can also be a resource. For these areas, a rating of '0' identifies a caregiver area that is a resource for the child, and a '1' identifies a potential resource. New needs may arise over time as circumstances change. Use the **CANS Needs and Resources Rating Key** to review rating definitions.

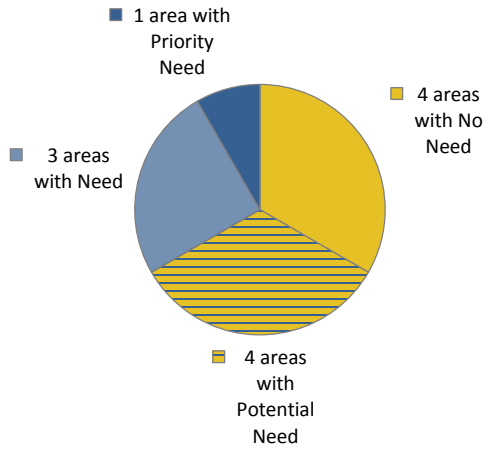

Review of Latest Resources and Needs

Based on the latest assessment on 4/1/2020, there are 4 current needs, 1 of which is a priority need. Mental Health, Safety and Organization are needs. Residential Stability is a priority need. There is 1 area which is a resource and 3 areas which are potential resources, displayed with filled stars. Supervision is a resource and Involvement with Care, Knowledge, and Social Resources are potential resource areas.

★ Supervision			The capacity to provide the level of monitoring and discipline or encouragement needed by the child.
★ Involvement with Care			Participation in the child's care and ability to advocate for the child.
★ Knowledge			Caregiver's understanding of the child's strengths and needs, and the rationale for treatment or management of the child's challenges.
★ Social Resources			Extended family and unpaid social supports that the caregiver can access in addressing the multiple needs of the child
☆ Safety			Caregiver's ability to protect the child from harm in the home.
☆ Organization			Caregiver's ability to organize and manage the household including the context of receiving community support and services for the child and/or family.
Areas of Need	Rating	Rating	Description
Residential Stability			The stability of the caregiver's housing. This does not include the likelihood that the child will be removed from the household.
Medical/Physical			Caregiver's medical issues and/or physical limitations that prevent or limit their ability to provide care for the child.
Mental Health			Caregiver's mental health challenges (excluding substance use) that limit their capacity to provide care for the child.
Developmental			The presence of limited cognitive capacity or developmental disabilities that challenges the caregiver's ability to provide care for the child.
Family Relationship to System			The degree to which the family's prior negative experience or apprehension to engage with the formal health care system.
Legal Involvement			Caregiver's involvement in the criminal justice system which effects their ability to parent the child.
